All registrants are required to read and agree to the 2025 General Policies. Failure to abide by these policies will affect your eligibility to participate in the Student Veterans of America (SVA) National Conference (NatCon) and other programming this year or in future years.

CONFERENCE BADGES

Each NatCon attendee must wear the conference badge issued by SVA and keep their conference badges visible at all times. SVA, its contractors, and The Broadmoor Resort and Convention Center have the right to deny access to NatCon events including breakout sessions and the SVA Campus to any attendee not wearing a conference badge.

Attendees may not exchange, give, trade or sell conference badges. SVA makes all final decisions on who has access to the Conference and what badges are issued for the Conference. SVA, its contractors, and The Broadmoor Resort and Convention Center may remove any person from the Conference that, in SVA's opinion, is violating or threatening to violate any of these rules or whose conduct is objectionable, disorderly, or disruptive. There may be a \$25.00 replacement charge for lost badges.

STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR

Electronic devices must be turned off or set to silent mode during educational sessions. Disruptive or objectionable conduct, activities and related materials (megaphones, signage, etc.) as determined by SVA, are strictly prohibited in every area of the Conference unless specifically approved by SVA in writing. No weapons of any kind are allowed at The Broadmoor Resort and Convention Center or any of the Conference facilities. Explosives, fuel, combustible, or hazardous materials are strictly prohibited.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT

It is SVA policy that guests, staff members, partners, and the general public are entitled to an environment free of sexual harassment at any SVA event. No one, regardless of identity, should be subjected verbally or physically to unsolicited and unwelcomed sexual overtures or conduct. This behavior is not welcome, is personally offensive, debilitates morale and, therefore, creates an unsafe environment. Behavior that amounts to sexual harassment may result in disciplinary action. If you experience or witness sexual harassment at any SVA event, report it immediately to any SVA staff member. All allegations of sexual harassment will be quickly investigated. To the extent possible, your confidentiality and that of any witnesses and the alleged harasser will be protected against unnecessary disclosure. When the investigation is completed, you will be informed of the outcome of that investigation.



DRESS FOR THE OCCASION



This style is acceptable and prevalent within many office settings and most events outside of work. While your business may allow for informal dress, make sure to avoid casual wear for the interview process. Acceptable: T-shirts, sweaters, jeans, shorts, sneakers, or sandals.

BUSINESS CASUAL

If you aren't positive what attire is needed for an event or an interview, your best bet is business casual, which incorporates elements of formal wear with elements of casual wear. Acceptable: Button-down shirts, khakis, blazers, pencil skirts, blouses, loafers, boots, heels, or closed-toed shoes.

BUSINESS PROFESSIONAL

Use this style for conservative work settings. As opposed to the loose-fitting nature of casual attire, business professional should be tailored according to your measurements. Acceptable: Full suit, tie, knee-length dresses or skirts, button-down shirts, blouses, dress shoes, heels, or closed-toed shoes.

Additional Note:

Business casual attire is requested for general sessions, breakout sessions, and the SVA Campus. Business professional attire is requested for the SVA Honors Luncheon. Semi-formal attire is requested for the National Student Veteran Ball.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY

It is SVA policy not to discriminate or screen guests on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status as an attendance requirement to any event. SVA is committed to providing an inclusive and welcoming environment at all SVA events. As an extension of SVA policy, SVA requires all guests to treat each other with dignity and respect. Any guest failing to adhere to this standard will be subject to disciplinary action.

CODE OF CONDUCT

In order to accomplish our mission, it is necessary to both ensure the safety of all of our guests during SVA activities, and to protect the brand and good standing of SVA in the eyes of the community. SVA trusts its members to hold themselves to a higher standard of morals and ethics, and to uphold these standards at all times. As policy, the following guidelines direct conduct for all SVA participants at any officially sponsored SVA event. Illegal or irresponsible conduct does more than simply tarnish the offender. It puts innocent people at risk, sullies the reputation of SVA, and undermines the ability of SVA to fulfill its mission of empowering veterans. While any criminal activity is clearly outside the scope of permissible conduct, the standards of conduct during officially sanctioned SVA events is considerably higher.

SVA expects its guests to at a minimum:

- Abide by all policies in this agreement, and comply with all federal, state, and local laws
- Conduct themselves in a professional manner that promotes safety and furthers the SVA mission
- Treat others with dignity and respect, and abide by the shared values of respect, honor, integrity, and excellence
- Refrain from using language that is profane, boisterous, sexually offensive, explicit, or of a derogatory racial or ethnic nature
- Attend every sanctioned SVA meeting/event without being under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and be prepared to fully participate, contribute, and meet training objectives
- At sanctioned social events, refrain from overindulging in alcoholic beverages
- Adhere to any guidance given by an SVA staff member, or duly appointed guest serving in a supervisory role



ACCESSIBILITY

SVA may provide, upon request, alternative formats, auxiliary aids, and services necessary for all individuals to participate in all programs and services provided by our organization. Requests for accommodations should be given at the time of registration or submitted at least three weeks in advance of the conference.

MEDIA RELEASE

The registrant gives SVA permission to photograph and video/audio record the registrant and to use the same in SVA's publications, promotions, and other media. The registrant understands that SVA has exclusive rights to these visual and audio recordings.

CHILDREN

Children under the age of 18 are not allowed in the SVA Campus during exhibitor load-in, load-out, and all other hours of operation. While children under the age of 18 are not permitted at NatCon, we fully support nursing mothers and will provide a private room during conference hours if needed. The content of the conference programming may not be suitable for children.

NO SUITCASING

Please note that while all meeting attendees are invited to the exhibition, any attendee who is observed to be soliciting business in the aisles or in other public spaces, in another company's booth, or in violation of the IAEE Exhibition Policy will be asked to leave immediately. Additional penalties may be applied. Please report any violations you may observe to conference management.

Do not attend NatCon 2025 if you are experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19 identified by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention at CDC.gov or if you have been in close contact with someone with confirmed or suspected COVID-19 symptoms.



Jared Lyon SVA NATIONAL PRESIDENT & CEO

Jared Lyon was appointed National President & CEO of Student Veterans of America (SVA) in 2016. He leads the organization's efforts to empower student veterans using the transformative power of higher education. Since he took office, Lyon has overseen SVA's growth to a network of more than 1,600 chapters on campuses in all 50 states and three countries representing over 750,000 student veterans. In 2017 Lyon led SVA's commitment to pass the "Forever GI Bill," the largest expansion of college aid for military veterans in a decade with an economic impact of \$3.4 Billion. A veteran of the U.S. Navy, he served as a submariner and diver, taking part in multiple deployments in support of the Global War on Terrorism.

Israel Del Toro UNITED STATES AIR FORCE SMSGT (RET.)

Senior, Master Sergeant Israel "DT" Del Toro's fight to survive began on the side of a mountain near Qalat, Afghanistan, after his Humvee detonated a concealed landmine. He suffered thirddegree burns over 80 percent of his body, as well as losing fingers on both hands from the blast. His comrades kept him conscious until DT could be airlifted out by reminding him of the promise he'd made that he would not leave his three year-old son without a father. That promise, along with the love and support of his family – his wife, his son, and his Air Force comrades – made possible a story of overcoming the greatest of odds. A recipient of the Pat Tillman Award at the 2017 ESPYs, DT now shares his story of triumph with audiences across the country, inspiring those that hear it to push themselves further if they know what they're fighting for.







Kristina Keenan DEPUTY DIRECTOR, NATIONAL LEGISLATIVE SERVICE, AT VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS (VFW)

Kristina Keenan is the Deputy Director for the National Legislative Service of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, focusing on legislation related to economic opportunities and education benefits. Since 2018, she has played a key role in passing major veteran legislation, including the Honoring Our PACT Act, earning recognition as a top lobbyist in 2022 by NILE and The Hill. A Minnesota native, Kristina served as a counterintelligence agent in the Minnesota Army National Guard, deploying twice to Bosnia before finishing her service as a sergeant in 2005. She holds degrees from the American University of Paris and Sciences Po and has worked in intelligence analysis at NATO and in leadership roles within the VFW's European community.

Jay Bowen VETERANS EMPLOYMENT AND EDUCATION COMMISSION CHAIRMAN, AMERICAN LEGION

Jay enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1971, serving 20 years in Air Defense Missile systems, including deployments to Germany and Saudi Arabia during Desert Shield. Rising to Chief Warrant Officer (CWO3), he retired after the Gulf War. Since 2005, Jay has been active in The American Legion, holding leadership roles at local, state, and national levels. He currently serves as National Chairman for Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation and is set to become National Commander in 2026. Jay holds degrees in Industrial Technologies and Procurement Management. Married to Jackie for over 50 years, they have two sons and four grandchildren.







Kali Brewster SENIOR FACILITATOR, PLAYFAIR INC.

Kaliswa Brewster is a Senior Facilitator at Playfair Inc., where she has been energizing groups at conferences, campuses, and corporations across the country for 13 years. An actress and producer based in New York, Kaliswa serves as President of the Board of Molière in the Park, Brooklyn's only free Off-Broadway theater. As an actress, her screen credits include recurring roles on Billions and Time After Time, as well as appearances on Law & Orer, Blue Bloods, Daredevil, and more. She has performed on stages across the U.S., and her voice can be heard on some of your favorite audiobooks and video games. No matter the medium, Kaliswa's work is fueled by a passion for building community and catalyzing connection through laughter, play, and the arts. Kaliswa's superpower? Turning a room of strangers into a group of friends in 90 minutes or less. Let the fun begin!

Hon. Denis McDonough U.S. SECRETARY OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Honorable Denis Richard McDonough was nominated by President Biden to lead the Department of Veterans Affairs. Mr. McDonough's nomination was confirmed by the United States Senate on February 8th, 2021, and he was sworn in the following day as the 11th Secretary of Veterans Affairs. On January 27, 2021, during his confirmation hearing, Secretary McDonough testified to Congress, "I will work tirelessly to build and restore VA's trust as the premier agency for ensuring the well-being of America's Veterans. After all, there is no more sacred obligation nor noble undertaking than to uphold our promises to our Veterans, whether they came home decades ago or days ago." Secretary McDonough served in the Obama Administration as the 26th White House Chief of Staff from February 2013 to January 2017.







Hon. Shereef Elnahal UNDER SECRETARY FOR HEALTH, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

Dr. Shereef Elnahal is the Under Secretary for Health at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA), overseeing a \$102.2 billion budget and care for over 9 million Veterans. Previously, he led University Hospital in Newark, NJ, through the COVID-19 pandemic as CEO and served as New Jersey's Health Commissioner, advancing health data sharing, maternal health, and opioid crisis solutions. A former VA Assistant Deputy Under Secretary, he co-founded the VHA Innovation Ecosystem. Dr. Elnahal holds an M.D. and M.B.A. from Harvard and has a distinguished record in healthcare leadership and innovation.

Hon. James D. Rodriguez

AND TRAINING SERVICE, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR

James D. Rodriguez serves as the U.S. Department of Labor's Assistant Secretary for Veterans' Employment and Training Service (VETS), overseeing programs that assist veterans, service members, and their spouses in securing meaningful careers. A U.S. Marine Corps veteran with over 30 years of experience in government and the corporate sector, Rodriguez has held leadership roles at Deloitte LLP and BAE Systems, Inc., and served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense in the Office of Warrior Care Policy. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from the University of Maryland and a Master of Arts in International Commerce and Policy from George Mason University. Additionally, Rodriguez is an adjunct faculty member in the Department of Government and Political Science at the University of Maryland Global Campus.







Hon. Joshua Jacobs UNDER SECRETARY FOR BENEFITS, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

Joshua Jacobs is the Under Secretary for Benefits, leading over 32,000 Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) employees in delivering non-medical benefits to millions of Veterans and their families. VBA oversees \$189 billion in direct benefits annually, including disability compensation for 6 million Veterans and pension benefits for nearly 300,000 survivors. Previously, Josh served as Senior Advisor for Policy in the Office of the Secretary, establishing governance and interagency policy processes. He has also worked with Booz Allen Hamilton and served nine years in the U.S. Senate, including as Deputy Staff Director for the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee. A University of Washington graduate, Josh and his wife, Julia, have three children.

Clinton L. Romesha FORMER ARMY STAFF SERGEANT AND MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENT

Staff Sergeant Clinton L. Romesha, born in Lake City, California, enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1999 as an M1 armor crewman. He served in Germany, Korea, and completed multiple deployments to Iraq and Afghanistan, demonstrating exceptional leadership and bravery throughout his military career. On October 3, 2009, during the Battle of Kamdesh at Combat Outpost Keating in Afghanistan, Romesha led a counterattack against an overwhelming enemy force of over 300 insurgents. Despite being wounded, he directed air support, rallied his troops, and rescued fellow soldiers, actions that earned him the Medal of Honor. Brandon Healy CAMP SOUTHERN GROUND


