As I reflect on all we accomplished, I am inspired by the progress and resilience of our student veterans and the vibrant community that supports them. Together, we have achieved remarkable milestones, setting a strong foundation for the future.

SVA continued to champion the success of student veterans across the nation. At the center of our work, the Success Hub, which ties the journey of servicemembers, veterans, and their families from the SVA Advising Center to the SVA Chapters, and then to the SVA Career Center, has seen marked investments, upgrades, and engagements. Through initiatives aimed at leadership development, academic achievement, and career readiness, we have upheld our mission to empower those who have served. Highlights of the year include:

- **Nearly 3,500** student veterans participated in our flagship programs, including the Leadership Institute, Regional Summits, Washington Week and our hallmark event, NatCon.
- A total of **81 advocacy meetings and four testimonies** ensured that veterans' voices were heard in Washington, D.C., leading to a submitted statement with the Senate Committee on Armed Services and Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

The impact of these efforts is measured not only in numbers but in the transformative stories of veterans reclaiming their futures. Whether it's a student veteran like Michael Sanchez who created a dedicated space that offered an inclusive environment where veterans could connect, share experiences, and find solidarity in their academic journey or the SVA Chapter at University of Washington Tacoma that recognized the importance of mental health and tailored workshops during Memorial Day and Veteran Day to address the unique challenges face by student veterans, the ripple effects of your support are undeniable.










# EMPOWERING VETERANS AT NATIONAL CONFERENCE

NatCon brought together over **2,200 attendees** in Nashville, TN. Over 60% of students reported that breakout sessions were relevant to their needs. NatCon helped increase the social capital of students with around 75% agreeing that the event helped them increase their peer networks, develop **high quality relationships**, and connect with individuals who have the ability to help them access resources they otherwise would not be able to attain.

While around 27% of students noted coming to NatCon with intent on **finding employment**, 38% said they would be following up with contacts from the NatCon campus about future employment, and 39% of partners reported **interviewing** or scheduling an interview with a NatCon attendee.





Washington Week empowered Student Veterans of America chapter members to amplify their voices in the heart of our Nation's capital. In preparation for this week, the Bruce Johnson II, Director, Federal Legislative Affairs and Steve Bachmann, Vice President, Legislative Affairs from the Boeing federal government affairs team provided invaluable information and a Q&A session, equipping student veterans with essential knowledge and strategies.

#### **BUILDING A STRONGER COMMUNITY**

SVA's Regional Summits are essential for Chapter continuity and growth, designed to equip SVA Chapters and their student veteran leaders—67% of whom are first-generation college students—and their faculty or staff advisors with the tools to strengthen their on-campus communities. Thanks to Boeing's investment, over 84% of attendees feel confident applying the curriculum's lessons, believing the skills learned will help their chapters grow. The Regional Summit experience has empowered these future leaders and fostered a stronger, more connected community.

# CREATING CONNECTIONS AT LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

#### **OCTOBER 18-21, 2023**

Leadership Insitute brought together 77 of SVA's top chapter leaders to Washington, D.C. for a four-day intensive workshop focused on honing their leadership ethos. This event aims to empower student veterans by building their confidence, fostering a sense of belonging, and aligning their personal values with their leadership roles.

#### **DEVELOPING LEADERSHIP ETHOS**

Prior to attending, all participants reported experiencing imposter syndrome and feelings of not belonging. However, after completing the program, 97% felt a strong growth as a leader, 93% reported increased confidence in their leadership abilities, and greater comfort with their personal values.

The end result is the **development of personal leadership ethos**—that "force" that guides beliefs, behaviors, and actions—as well as a tight-knit community of fellow chapter leaders and mentors to support personal growth.



By investing in research, SVA is filling the void in data collection on the student veterans experience, highlighting their challenges and successes. We also use surveys and program evaluations for data collection and improving programs.



# **GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS**



SVA's Government Affairs Department shapes policy proposals and regulations on behalf of veterans in career advancement higher pursuit through of education. Our team works closely with Congress, the White House, and the federal government to promote forward-looking policies that will help veterans acquire the education they need to thrive in the modern workforce.

# POLICY MOVEMENTS FOR STUDENT VETERANS

The Government Affairs (GA) team focuses on a myriad of issues, and analyses a wide variety of proposals concerning matters that impact veterans in higher education. As subject-matter experts on higher education and veterans policy, the SVA GA team is frequently called upon from Congress and senior government officials to deliver testimony regarding topics facing student veterans.

#### INCREASE TO ONLINE MONTHLY HOUSE ALLOWANCE

**H.R. 5702**, Expanding Access for Online Veteran Students Act, will establish the full national average monthly housing stipend under the Post-9/11 Educational Assistance Program for individuals who pursue summer education program solely through distance learning.



# RESTORE VA EDUCATION BENEFIT ENTITLEMENT

Create Student Veteran Benefit Restoration Act aims to make the student veteran "whole" by instructing the VA not to charge an individual if the VA determines the student could not complete the course or program because:

- it was suspended or terminated based on information gathered through a VA risk-based survey; or
- The Department of Education determines the institution committed an actionable act or omission that detrimentally affected direct loan borrowers.



# CONTINUED POLICY MOVEMENTS

#### IMPROVE AND EXPAND VA WORK STUDY PROGRAM (VAWS)

Several pieces of legislation look to make improvements and expand the VAWS.

- Expand eligibility to students who are half-time basis
- Expand the type of qualifying activities participants can pursue to better align with academic and professional goals
- Increase pay
- Modernize the time-keeping process
- Require VA to report detailed information about how the program serves participants



# EXPAND VA'S NATION VETERANS SUICIDE PREVENTION REPORT

**H.R. 4157**, Not Just a Number Act, aims to enhance accountability and transparency in the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) regarding suicide prevention efforts. The bill requires the VA to produce an annual National Veterans Suicide Prevention Report and make it publicly available. It also mandates a review of VA mental health and suicide prevention services based on Government Accountability Office recommendations.



# EVEN MORE POLICY MOVEMENTS

# IMPROVE VA PAYMENT SYSTEM TO FOREIGN INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Language from **S. 1090** will direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to update the VA's payment system to enable electronic fund transfers of educational assistance to foreign institutions of higher education.

#### RUDISILL V. MCDONOUGH AMICUS BRIEF

SVA tracked this case's developments, as it can impact many current and future student veterans. The majority opinion clarified that veterans with dual entitlements can access their benefits independently, as long as they stay within the 48-month cap. In August 2023, SVA submitted an **Amicus Brief** supporting the veteran before the Supreme Court proceedings.

#### EXTEND VET-TEC PILOT PROGRAM

The **VET-TEC Authorization Act of 2023** would require VA to extend enrollment for an additional 4,000 veterans per year the opportunity to enroll in high technology programs of education that provide non-degree training or skills related to computer programming, media application, data processing, or information sciences to help them develop skills to start or advance their careers in high-tech industries.



### VFW-SVA LEGISLATIVE FELLOWSHIP CHANGES STUDENTS' PATH

In keeping with its shared commitment to student veterans' success, every year the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) teams up with SVA to host the VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship program, providing an opportunity for up to 10 exemplary VFW members who are student veterans to make their voices heard on Capitol Hill and in their community.

The VFW-SVA Legislative Fellowship is another example of the strong collaboration between VFW and SVA that resulted from a memorandum of understanding signed by the two organizations at the SVA National Conference in January 2013.
