CONFERENCE OVERVIEW AND WHAT TO EXPECT

The Student Veterans of America® (SVA) National Conference (NatCon) is one of the largest gatherings of student veterans in the world. NatCon brings together student veterans, military-connected individuals, higher education professionals, employers, nonprofits, and government leaders.

NatCon is designed to help attendees:

- Connect with peers and partners
- Build leadership and professional skills
- Explore career and education pathways
- Engage in service, advocacy, and community building

LOCATION, TRAVEL, AND LODGING

Conference Venue: The Broadmoor Resort and Convention Center, 1 Lake Ave., Colorado Springs, CO 80906

Set against the backdrop of the Rocky Mountains, The Broadmoor offers a stunning, resort-style setting that makes NatCon both energizing and restorative. Beyond NatCon, attendees can enjoy the history of the venue, as well as free on-site amenities including a pool and fitness center, with options to take advantage of the Broadmoor's coffee and souvenir shops, (and bowling alley!), making it easy to relax, recharge, and connect throughout the weekend.

We're excited to once again host the 18th Annual NatCon across the entire Broadmoor in 2026, meaning everyone you see throughout the resort will be part of the NatCon community. This is your space, and you are among your people.

The Broadmoor is a large resort-style property. While most conference activities will take place on the Northeast side of the resort indoors between Bartolin Hall to Colorado Hall, expect walking from your room to sessions outdoors. Allow extra travel time, and pack for outdoor travel.

The Broadmoor does offer free shuttle services to take folks around the resort for those staying in rooms further away from the conference activities.



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Time Zone: All programming is listed in Mountain Time (MT)

Airport Travel Options

- Colorado Springs Airport (**COS**): 20 minutes from the venue
- Denver International Airport (**DEN**): 90 minutes from the venue
- One way or round-trip transportation services to/from the airport and resort are available to book
- Rideshare services and rental cars also service the hotel (*pricing varies - inquiry with your preferred provider*)

Parking at The Broadmoor

- **Parking Garage:** The overnight Self-Parking Fee for hotel guests is \$35 per night with full in and out privileges
- **Visitors:** For guests visiting the property, but not staying overnight, garage parking is available with daily charges beginning at \$5 per half hour, and a maximum daily charge of \$25
- **Valet Parking:** \$45 per night

Cheyenne Mountain Resort (*overflow hotel*)

- Cheyenne Mountain Resort is a short 5-minute drive from The Broadmoor; it serves as SVA's overflow hotel for 2026, meaning many NatCon attendees will also be staying at this resort.
- Parking at Cheyenne Mountain Resort is free.
- A free shuttle will be running between Cheyenne Mountain and The Broadmoor for the duration of NatCon; shuttle locations and times will be posted, with shuttles running every 20 minutes.

If you are unable to acquire a room at either The Broadmoor or Cheyenne Mountain, there are a multitude of lodging opportunities in the nearby town of Colorado Springs. Please check with your lodging provider on policies and transportation options to the Broadmoor for NatCon.



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REGISTRATION, CHECK-IN, AND PRE-CONFERENCE EVENTS

Hotel check-in and NatCon registration are separate processes; please be sure to complete both.

NatCon's on-site conference check-in and registration opens **Thursday, January 8, at 7:00 AM in Broadmoor Hall D&E**. At check-in, attendees will be able to:

- Complete their check-in with conference staff
- Register or pay their outstanding balance by check or credit card (please do these prior to attending, if possible)
- Print conference badges at self-service kiosks
- Select their dining option for Friday's "Dinner at the Broadmoor: Dine Around" (student attendees only)

As capacity allows, all attendees will also have the opportunity to participate in pre-conference activities on January 8, including:

SCHEDULE, MOBILE APP, AND PROGRAMMING

The 18th Annual NatCon schedule is available online and the mobile app. The schedule will continue to be updated until January 5, 2026, and is subject to change.



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NatCon 2026 will use the **SVA Programs mobile app**. Free wi-fi will be available in the conference spaces.

- 18th Annual NatCon content becomes available in the app by January 5, 2026
- A full, final schedule will be accessible in the app, where attendees will be able to build their personal NatCon agenda, receive real-time updates and notifications, see other NatCon attendees, and get access to more resources and information.

Types of Events at NatCon

- **Breakout Sessions:** Interactive, 45-minute sessions delivered by partners, chapters, SVA staff, and other VSOs focused on a variety of topics like leadership, personal development, advocacy, and career advancement. Attendees will select to attend one breakout session from multiple offerings during each breakout session timeslot.
- **Featured Panels:** Moderated discussions with experts and veteran leaders.
- **Main Stage Events:** Large plenary sessions with keynote speakers.
- **Special Events:** Celebratory and connection events like the Honors Luncheon, National Student Veteran Ball, Regional Lunch.
- **Wellness and Community Events:** Movement, mindfulness, storytelling, and connection-focused programming with partners like wear blue: run to remember, Veteran's Yoga Project, and more, including an evening movie screening.

The SVA Campus is the exhibitor and engagement hall located in Bartolin Hall where attendees will connect with employers, sponsors, and partners; explore career pathways and resources; and participate in networking and activations.

Campus Preparation Tips

- Bring multiple copies of your resume (digital and print) and/or business cards
- Practice your elevator pitch
- Research employers and organizations at NatCon beforehand
- Enroll in SVA's Professional Development series and build in-demand skills before NatCon with our Google Career Certificate program. You'll get access to 384 individual courses or full certificates in nine high-demand fields at a 100% free, self-paced, virtual experience.

DRESS CODE AND WHAT TO PACK

Dress Code: While we offer attire guidance for some events, business casual is appropriate for all NatCon programming. No one should feel discouraged from attending based on clothing accessibility.

General Guidelines

- Casual: T-shirts, sweaters, jeans, sneakers, sandals
- Business Casual: Button-downs, blouses, blazers, khakis, closed-toe shoes
- Business Professional: Suits, ties, dresses, dress shoes
- Semi-formal: Cocktail or mid-length dresses, dressy jumpsuits, suits or dress slacks with a blazer and dress shoes (tie optional)



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Dress Code By Event

- General Sessions and SVA Campus: Business casual
- Honors Luncheon: Business professional
- National Student Veteran Ball: Business Professional or Semi-formal
- Physical Activities (service project, yoga, and 5k): layered athletic wear suitable for outdoors, jacks, and closed toed shoes
- Conference After Hours Personal Time: Casual
